### Impact in Central Maryland

#### Family Centers (FY24 through Q3):

- 149 individuals served, including
  75 parents and 74 children
- **67%** high school graduation rate for studentparents at Benjamin Franklin High School in Brooklyn Neighborhood Zone
- 100% high school graduation rate for studentparents at Excel Academy in Poppleton Neighborhood Zone\*
- 100% of families served at Columbia Family Center were living at or below the ALICE Threshold\*\*

# Strategic Targeted Eviction Prevention (STEP) Program (FY24):

- 3,384 program beneficiaries
- 1,484 households approved, \$9.89 million distributed to prevent eviction

#### Family Stability Program (cumulative from inception):

- 2,717 families served, including 5,120 schoolage children
- 99.4% of school-age children have avoided a disruptive school transfer
- **98.2%** of families remained housed during program
- 85.9% of program exits were successful
