Impact in Baltimore City



Family Centers: Brooklyn | Poppleton (FY24 through Q3):

94 individuals served, including **46** parents and **46** children

211 Maryland at United Way of Central Maryland (FY24):

- **57,330** calls answered
- **Top needs:** Housing, Utility Assistance, Food Assistance



Neighborhood Zones (FY24 through Q3):

Brooklyn | Poppleton

- **29** focus groups & stakeholder meetings conducted
- **\$107,733+** in total external dollars invested from community engagement efforts

Community School Partner Schools (FY24 through Q3): **6 Schools**



- **3,785+** students served, with United Way as the lead community schools partner
- **177+** partnerships
- **\$1,181,761+** invested (cash and in-kind)
- **700+** volunteers engaged

Central Maryland Regional Veterans Treatment Court (FY24 through Q3):



- **35** veterans served
- **6** veterans graduated from the program

Young Men United (School Year 2023-24 mid-year):

- **45** total students served (Partner schools are Benjamin Franklin and Patterson high schools)
- **37** students (82%) were successfully promoted to the 11th grade and stayed in school

Impact in Baltimore City

Housing:



Strategic Targeted Eviction Prevention (STEP) Program (FY24):

- **2,054** program beneficiaries
- **\$5.03M** distributed to prevent eviction

Family Stability Program (Cumulative from program inception through mid-year FY24):

- **1,231** families served, including **2,239** school-age children
- **97.2%** of families remained housed during program
- **99.5%** of school-age children have avoided a disruptive school transfer

Housing Relocation and Emergency Assistance Program:

- **40** individuals served in **18** households
- **\$57,300+** distributed to prevent eviction
